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## **Letter from the President**

Howdy! It's an honor to author the 2023-2024 President's Annual Report. I greatly enjoyed being your AALHE President and appreciate the opportunity to highlight the accomplishments of the organization over the last year.

As you may recall, we ended Kathleen Gorski's presidency with a significant organizational restructuring. This included sunsetting two committees; creating spin offs of the Publications and Professional Development committees; and creating a Governance Board sub-committee. We also brought the Association Executive Group (AEG) onboard in Fall 2022 to serve as our association management company.



If the 2023-2024 year could be summed up in two words, they would be "continuity" and "community." Given the restructuring made the previous year, the best stewardship was to implement these changes, assess where adjustments might need to be made, and work with the President-Elect to ensure that ideas and achievements transcend the current President.

Community is truly the heart and soul of AALHE. The organization wouldn't exist without our members and wouldn't thrive without our volunteers. This was an exciting year for our committees, including a literal Welcome Wagon at our annual conference (thanks, Member Engagement!) and timely webinars and discussions around the rise of AI and implications for assessment.

Speaking of our annual conference, we gathered in Portland, OR June 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> to trailblaze, traverse, and transform together. We had over 320 in-person conference attendees and 8 sponsors and exhibitors. We are excited that we continue to receive rich, engaging conference proposal submissions and that our registration numbers continue the return to pre-pandemic numbers. A thank you to AEG, Executive Director Peggy Moede, current President Constance Tucker, and the 2023-2024 Conference Committee for leading the conference with energy, commitment, and grace.

Our final event of the 2023-2024 year was our Annual Meeting, held on June 28, 2024, where we recapped the last year and looked ahead to 2024-2025. This report includes highlights covered in that meeting, including the progress we have made toward the fulfillment of our current strategic plan, which was extended through June 2024. I'm excited for what's to come, as Constance steps into AALHE stewardship and I start a victory lap that will culminate in the end of a most excellent 6 years serving on the AALHE Board. I hope to see you at webinars and other events throughout the year, and at our 2025 Annual Conference!

Intersection: Published Volume 4 and added a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) to Intersection articles. The DOI provides articles with a permanent web address.

Emerging Dialogues: Published four articles in 2023-2024, with 2 currently pending.

The Association for the Assessment of Learning in Higher Education will diversify revenue streams to mitigate risk and provide resources to support organizational success.

Professional Webinars Sub-committee: Delivered the "More than Bricks and Mortar" 4-part webinar series.

Finance: Successfully proposed the creation of a standalone Treasurer position.

## **Board of Directors Accomplishments and Highlights**

- Hosted AALHE's second fully in-person conference since 2020 in Portland, OR. The
  conference theme was Trailblazing, Traversing, and Transforming: Cultivating Student Learning
  Through Effective and Innovative Assessment. More than 320 attendees engaged in over 70
  sessions, including invited panels and a workshop with our keynote speaker. This would not
  have been successful without the support of AEG, President-Elect Constance Tucker, and our
  volunteer Conference Committee.
- Welcomed Conference Keynote Speaker José Antonio Bowen, Ph.D., F.R.S.A., who presented on "Thinking with A.I. and the Future of Assessment" and led a follow up workshop on "A.I. Literacy for Assessment & Accreditation."
- Engaged in visioning activities related to the future of assessment and of AALHE to prepare for updating our Mission, Vision, Values, and Strategic Goals.
- Created a standalone Treasurer position, thus removing this responsibility from the Past-President's portfolio. Moved the Secretary responsibilities from a standalone position to the Past-President. Also removed conference co-chair responsibilities from the President-Elect's portfolio, thus easing the transition from President-Elect to President.
- Launched AALHE's second professional webinar series, More Than Bricks and Mortar. This
   4-part series invited advanced assessment practitioners to share insights on topics from
   building a foundation for assessment practice to communicating results to multiple layers of
   stakeholders.
- Joined our former Executive Director, Nancy Short, in celebrating her retirement and transitioned in new Executive Director Peggy Moede.
- Updated the Book Club committee to Sharing Professional Assessment Reading and Knowledge (SPARK) to better reflect ongoing committee work beyond the summer book reading. Also, approved the merger of the Professional Webinar and Member Webinar committees to streamline work and better serve our members.
- Approved new 3 year terms for Board members, rather than 5 years, taking effect with terms that start in 2024.
- Implemented the first of many Past Presidents Panels at our 2024 Conference. This year's panel featured Monica Stitt-Bergh, Andre Foisy, and Kathleen Gorski.
- Remembered Jen Sweet, longtime AALHE member and volunteer, at both the 2024 Conference and in an upcoming edition of *Intersection: A Journal at the Intersection of Assessment and Learning*.

## 2023-2024 Financial Report

Shared by Leslie Harris, AALHE Treasurer at the annual member meeting, June 28, 2024

AALHE continues to be in a strong financial position:

- For 2023, we had a net income of \$36,374.32.
- We ended 2023 with an overall surplus of \$492,607.57.

Our accounts are split across three banks to attain FDIC protection of funds and to maximize interest rates, which range from 1% to 4.3%.

Membership in 2023 trended up, with fewer individual members but more institutional members.

Our 2024 Conference revenue is on budget; however, expenses are predicted to exceed the budget as a result of cost increases and reduced sponsorship income.
